Message from the President



Greetings ZMM Members,

September 8th is National Literacy Day. Statistics state that over 773 million people in the world today are illiterate, two-thirds of whom are women. Illiteracy becomes a Women's Right issue when you consider the inequalities women face each day just because of their gender. When a woman is illiterate, it drastically affects the quality of job opportunities available to her. When she can't read or even write her name, it excludes her from basic human rights. An illiterate women can lead to the likelihood of her experiencing gender-based violence, dependence on coping mechanisms, isolation, vulnerability to deception.

Mr. Ban wrote in the United Nations News that "Literate women are more likely to send their children, especially their girls, to school," he said. "By acquiring literacy, women become more economically self-reliant and more actively engaged in their country's social, political and cultural life. All evidence shows that investment in literacy for women yields high development dividends." He also noted "Every literate woman marks a victory over poverty,"

Alice Ross, Service Committee Co-Chair, and Erma Barron Director presented the committee's goals and projects:

- Partner with the Family Justice Center—the Holiday
 Hope program for Thanksgiving and Christmas
- Free the Girls project will collect new and gently used bras throughout the year and mail them the latter part of the Spring in 2023
- Communicate with the St. Ann's Center to discuss items that can be contributed to young mothers housed at the Center
- Consult with the director of Promise Place, an emergency/temporary youth shelter to determine how we can be of service to the young women
- Incarcerated Women Project will provide Ziploc bags of personal items for the women who reside in the Correctional Institute for

Women in Jessup. MD

- Continue to contribute the scholarship to Prince George's Community College
- Continue the Young Women in Public Affairs award and include extensive outreach activities
- Explore providing services to the residents of Safe Haven, a shelter for victims of domestic violence

Tammie Edwards – 1st Vice President and Membership Chair, presented the following:
